

Headteacher Update

We haven't been very lucky with the weather this week, especially at drop off! Despite this, the children have given me a lovely welcome when I have been outside at the start of the day and are maintaining their high standards of good manners. Very impressive!

This week we discussed courage during assembly on Monday and linked it to the story of David and Goliath as well as the children sharing some of their experiences of courage. It was all very interesting.

Yesterday, we had a School Parliament meeting and I would like to share an example of kindness from one of our members. We were discussing some ideas for whole school events and the children came up with planting some fruit trees, one for each class. I was questioning the children about how this would work and how we could pay for it. One of the children then said, "Mr Graves I have some pocket money saved up at home so I could pay for them." I thought this was a very thoughtful gesture showing kindness.

Hopefully, you will have read our letter about the very exciting Reading Mission which we launched this week. There is a display in each classroom for the children to track their progress on their mission. The more children read, the better they get and this in turn helps unlock the whole curriculum, providing a firm foundation for success not only at school but in later adult life. We are looking for some more volunteers to listen to individual children read on a regular basis to improve fluency and help inspire a love of reading. You could be a parent, aunt, uncle, gran, grandad, cousin or family friend – all are welcome! We can be flexible with timings during the school day. All volunteers would need a DBS check. If you are interested in becoming a volunteer, please contact the school office initially.

More good news...we have managed to get a 3D printer on loan! I am hoping to work with some children across the school to help trial it over the next couple of weeks! 
